City Manager Potpourri

A big thank you to all who attended the City's Main Street 4th of July celebration. We will be sure to make this an annual event for the Citizens of Choctaw moving forward. Weather cooperated and it was a pleasure to see the joy on children's faces as they played on the water inflatables your Parks and Recreation staff acquired for the event. I also observed many happy parents relaxing under the shade tent enjoying lunch with their favorite beverage. Looking to the future the city is planning a Main Street Christmas Tree lighting event for early December-stay tuned for date and details.

Recreation and Open Spaces efforts. With the new budget passed the City has a few improvements on the horizon for your parks and open spaces. Prior to the end of the fiscal year staff installed "pet stations" along Choctaw Creek Trail to make it more convenient for pet owners to take care of and dispose of their pets' waste. Staff is working with the Choctaw Youth Soccer community on the possibility of clearing a regulation space for a soccer field just South of the Farmers Market area. The City acquired a grant from the Rotary Club to place 6 exercise stations and fall zones along the Choctaw Creek Trail to promote healthy outdoor exercise. The project is set to start early Fall. Recreation staff is working with vendors on proposals for new playground equipment near the picnic area at the Main En-

trance of Choctaw Creek Park. Playground equipment will be a welcome addition to the park. Timing for a late Fall install. Researching costs for renovation and complete install of new toilet facilities at Choctaw Creek Park as well as renovation of pavilion roofs, installation of grills and new picnic tables around picnic areas of Choctaw Creek Park. Following through with the comprehensive park plan, purchased new playground equipment to install near the splash pad of 10 Acre/ Bouse Park. The City received grant money to construct trails connecting 10 Acre Lake and Bouse Park. The project is 55% complete and should be done by Christmas. Looking to the future, within the next 5 years, develop and execute a Parks and Open Spaces plan outlining a comprehensive approach to equipment replacement, facility repair and replacement, programming, and new community recreation space requirements.

Contrary to some Social Medial posts, the Animal Welfare Contract with Midwest City is not cancelled. I attended a meeting this week in Midwest City to discuss the possibility of setting up a cooperative committee to look at options for an Eastern Oklahoma County regional facility where multiple cities would contribute to the operation and funding. Much more to follow...

Roads improvement. Met with Oklahoma Department of Transportation to discuss a project for 23rd and Indian Meridian. The City budgeted for a milling and overlay for a portion of Indian Meridian connecting to 23rd to smooth this road out a bit. The city also budgeted for a milling and overlay of Choctaw and 29th, and 10th and Indian Meridian. These projects should start late fall depending on equipment availability and funding.
